Uniform Policy

All pupils are expected to wear school uniform. The staff and governors believe it gives the school an identity and encourages the children to take pride in both their appearance and their school.

We ask all parents who send their children to our school to support the school uniform policy. We believe that parents have a duty to send their children to school correctly dressed and ready for their daily schoolwork. One of the responsibilities of parents is to ensure that their child has the correct uniform, and that it is clean and in good repair.

The school sweatshirt colour is green.

Sweatshirts, polo shirts and P.E bags with an embroidered logo are available for purchase from:

We encourage the wearing of school badges for the children's safety as it makes them more identifiable.

Children should wear:

- Shirts, blouses or polo shirts in white
- Sweatshirts, jumpers or cardigans in green
- Long or short trousers in grey
- Knee length skirts or pinafore dresses in grey
- Knee length dresses in green check
- Tights and socks must be in plain white, black, grey. (No footless tights, socks above the knee or leggings).

Shoes/footwear:

- Black shoes (no other colours, logos or wheels).
- All shoes should have a low heel.
- Laces should be plain black.

PE uniform

- Yellow t-shirt with school logo
- Plain green shorts
- Trainers (plain white or black) or plimsolls
- In the colder months it is important that the children are dressed appropriately for outdoor P.E. They can wear black or blue tracksuit pants/trousers and a jumper.

Children are expected to wear school uniform unless there is a justified reason why they may not. If your child cannot temporarily wear uniform, please send in a letter stating the reasons why.

Ideally no items of jewellery, apart from watches should be worn. If your child has their ears pierced they may wear a plain stud however they must be able to take their own earrings out for PE and the school takes no responsibility for any accidents relating to the wearing of earrings in school. Due to health and safety, children are not allowed to wear earrings in PE. During the period in which they are newly pierced (6 weeks), the child will need to wear plasters over their ears for P.E. which should be sent in with the child. It recommended that any ear piercing should be done in the summer holidays, giving the ears time to heal over the holidays.

In the interest of health and safety, it is requested that children tie their hair back, when possible. Plain bands should be worn without any attachments.

Make-up and nail varnish are not permitted

Unnatural hair colouring is not permitted; the interpretation of 'unnatural' is as follows:

- - a colour that is not found within the natural hair colour spectrum, i.e. a bright,
- extreme or vivid colour;
- - a combination of colours that is easily visible or stark in contrast.

Shaved hair should be a minimum of number 3 and 'tramlines' are not acceptable.

Please label all school uniform with your child's name.

We feel that Weaverham Forest is an excellent school. Wearing school uniform reinforces our school ethos and allows your child to be an integral part of our nurturing and caring community.
